Art can give kids confidence to try something without fearing failure. Now more than ever, children need to be encouraged to think outside the box and recognize their individuality.

Just Art – An Elementary Art Docent Program is for children grades kindergarten to fifth. The program is a six-year art curriculum so students will never receive the same project twice. Gold Ridge Elementary School has been thriving with this program since 2014.

The program provides **six art docent lessons per school year**. Each one-hour art lesson is a two-part PowerPoint presentation.

PART ONE

An art history lesson to teach about one of the following:

- An artist (male or female, current or historical)
- Art Theory
- Cultural art
- A children's book author/illustrator

PART TWO

A step-by-step art project. Each academic year provides a variety of lessons that include a mix of mediums:

- Acrylic painting
- Watercolor painting
- Oil pastels
- Collage
- Colored pencils
- Crayons

To assist your school appointed volunteer art docent coordinator, Just Art provides:

- A summary sheet with an art materials supply list
- A list of California core art skills covered in the lesson
- A presentation to aid the art docent conducting the lesson

To make Just Art more powerful, I devote one evening per month to providing hands-on training for the art docents of your school to give them the confidence to teach the project, not to mention having a blast doing the art project themselves.




MY PHILOSOPHY AND PROGRAM

RACHEL A. DILLON'S BIOGRAPHY

Rachel Dillon graduated from the University of Wisconsin, Madison in 1994, with a Bachelor of Science in Art, emphasizing in Graphic Design. She received a Master of Science in Instructional Design and Technology in 2022 from CSU Fullerton.

In 2009, her non-fiction children's book, "Through Endangered Eyes – a poetic journey into the wild," was published by Windward Publishing, an imprint of Finney Company. She both wrote and illustrated it.

Her book received an Eric Hoffer Honorable Mention award in 2010. Rachel has been a featured artist in "Wildscape Magazine," a contributing artist in gallery and museum exhibitions, and a speaker at Art Educator conventions and conferences. The Nature Conservancy commissioned Rachel to produce two paintings for them in 2015.

Rachel taught art and developed the art curriculum at Brighton Private Elementary School in Folsom from 2012-2015.

Rachel developed a six-year rotational Art Docent curriculum, comprised of six projects per year. Gold Ridge Elementary in Folsom has been utilizing the Just Art program since 2014.
